"On Mandela's Truth and Reconciliation Commission (TRC) South Africa"

Peter Schröder is a GP and psychotherapist who worked mainly with traumatised refugees in Germany as well as with victims internationally.

From 1996-1997 Peter worked as a volunteer with the TRC, assisting witnesses with his vast trauma therapy experience. The nationwide commission consisted of:

- The Human Rights Violations Committee which investigated human rights abuses on all sides that occurred between 1960 and 1994.
- The Reparation & Rehabilitation Committee was charged with restoring survivors' dignity and formulating proposals to assist with rehabilitation.
- The Amnesty Committee considering applications from individuals.

Peter worked mainly with the human rights violation committee in KwaZulu-Natal, and will introduce this unique commission and show a few pictures and films.

Nelson Mandela developed the idea of a truth commission in jail (1960-1989).
