Information will be published before Easter, and from 31 March 2021 the game manual and schedule can be downloaded from Breisach-Touristik's website.

Using your smartphone, you will be guided from station to station, and at each point along the way, there will be riddles to solve and questions to answer leading you to the treasure chest at the end. And to keep you motivated, you can also pick up a treat at one of several ice cream parlours along the route, which are open for take away.

## Vancouver - The New Familiar

When we decided to move back to Vancouver in the summer of 2019, having lived in Freiburg for 11 years, I told myself - no problem, Lufthansa flies every day at 4:00pm from Vancouver direct to Frankfurt, so if I ever need to go, catch up, see, hug, spend time with family or friends, I can be there within ten hours. Never did I imagine how far away Germany can really feel from Vancouver.

I think we all felt the same during the COVID-19 pandemic throughout this past year having all been apart from family and friends whether or not separated by large distances or an ocean.



When we returned to Canada, we found a lovely place in Vancouver's Kitsilano neighbourhood, two blocks from the kids' new high school, a ten-minute drive down town to David's office and a short walk to the beach.



Martin and Anna have adjusted very quickly to school here yet both have maintained strong ties to their close friends back in Freiburg. I never thought I would actually say this - but thanks to modern media, it is easy to stay in touch, despite the separation of distance and time zones. Regrettably, six months into their first school year here, the whole world was hit by the pandemic, which stalled whatever social contact Martin and Anna were starting to form here through sports and school activities with their new peers. Fortunately, both kids have inherited our positive attitude and, as a family, we are making the best of the current situation.

British Columbia, Canada's most westerly province where Vancouver is situated, has lumbered through the pandemic relatively well.



Tolerable restrictions were kept in place throughout the year. Limited travel was allowed outside the province, and the border to the US remained closed to non-essential trips. Elementary schools were kept open, whilst high schools moved to a half classroom instruction, and half to online teaching, with smaller class-sizes. Facemasks are required in shops, schools and public places and restaurants are open with limited seating allowing only one household per table. This has ensured some sense of normality although it is still a far stretch from the usual busy Vancouver lifestyle.



And so, we have seen every season come and go, and I can say that I feel like we have settled in, although our thoughts are still regularly in Freiburg. It is like we have two hometowns and our hearts just grew larger to accommodate all the dear friends we have on both sides of the ocean.
