The Sun King, Louis XIV of France, famously referred to the town as ''my jewel.''

Freiburg's Grand Dame - then and now. Join us for a lively tour of this unique oasis for women!

Lorettobad, lovingly known as Lollo, is not only the oldest open-air pool complex in Freiburg (1841), but the oldest in the whole of Germany. Not content with these historic claims, it also hosts the unique Damenbad, the sole women-only pool in the country. The Damenbad is a little Jugendstil gem in the Wiehre, a ''living room'' for a lively mix of students and young Muslim girls, mothers-to-be, octogenarians and tiny tots (boys are allowed entry up to the age of three). It has two songs dedicated to it, has been the focus of several television documentaries, radio programmes and art projects, and provided the incentive for an eccentric film comedy by Doris Dörrie.



Member Mairi Sinclair, who is on the committee of the *Freunde des Lorettobades*, will give us a quick tour of the family area (the largest 'public garden' in Freiburg), relating the unusual history of the site as we go, and then in the Damenbad itself enlighten us with tales and illustrations of some of the weird and wonderful escapades this Grande Dame has lived through. Those of you who would first like to enjoy a dip in the historic Damenbad can join us an hour earlier.

Dinner will follow in the nearby restaurant of the same name 'Lollo'.

Looking back at the evening with the Network, I am filled with sincere gratitude for the opportunity to share my puppetry research. The guestions, warm reception and, may I say, enthusiastic response to my ''Little Riding Red Hood'' demonstration, even after running over time with the formal talk, touched me deeply.
